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New in 2025: Building more homes, faster

What you need to know: Governor Newsom signed important changes into law that take effect in 2025 – including expanding housing access and spurring the development of more homes, faster.

As the new year soon begins, California continues its forward momentum with a new set of laws signed by Governor Newsom that improve the health, safety, and well-being of all Californians.

Through partnership with the Legislature, we're strengthening public safety, building more housing, and providing more resources for our communities. These practical reforms protect what matters most while creating more opportunities for all Californians."

Building more homes, faster

Here are just some of the laws taking effect in 2025 that will create more housing for all Californians:

• More housing in more communities: SB 1037 by Senator Scott Wiener (D-San Francisco) cracks down on local governments that block or delay approved housing, imposing penalties up to \$50,000 per month — funds that go right back into supporting affordable housing in those same areas. Meanwhile, AB 3093 by Assemblymember Chris Ward (D-San Diego) updates the rules so cities and counties must plan for everyone's housing needs — especially folks at the lowest income levels — so that all Californians can have a place to live.

- **Expanding emergency shelter options:** SB 1395 by Senator Josh Becker (D-Menlo Park) makes it easier to develop and operate interim housing, including emergency shelters and navigation centers. These facilities provide more than a place to stay – they connect people with housing assistance, health care, and other services to help them get back on their feet.
- **Expanding farmworker housing:** Every day, California's farmworkers put food on tables of residents across the state, yet many struggle to find homes near the fields where they work. AB 3035 by Assemblymember Gail Pellerin (D-Santa Cruz) makes it easier to build new farmworker housing in Santa Clara and Santa Cruz Counties, helping agricultural workers live closer to their jobs and spend more time with their families.

Why it matters: By streamlining processes and holding local governments accountable, these changes will create more housing available for Californians across all income levels.

Artificial intelligence and chip money: 2024 California technology year in review

Over the last year, California technology grew so pervasive and important that its impact finally became a central preoccupation of California government.

Some of that impact was positive, like a surge of unexpected tax revenue that likely came from one or more profit-gushing, capital-intensive Golden State tech companies like AI chipmaker Nvidia.

But lawmakers were more concerned with harms than benefits.

Gov. Gavin Newsom signed into law bills banning deepfake campaign ads, deepfake content on big online platforms, and disclosure of artificial intelligence content in advertising.

The governor also signed a bill requiring California schools to limit or ban student use cellphones, codifying statewide a practice that has become increasingly common at the district level as educators look to refocus students. Schools

in Los Angeles and San Diego took a more critical look at their use of artificial intelligence after unhappy surprises involving chatbots and grading software. The state bureaucracy moved to update enforcement of existing laws to account for AI. The California Civil Rights Department moved to restrict how employers use the technology to screen job applicants while the Government Operations Agency set rules for how state departments themselves use it.

There were limits to the regulatory impulse: The governor vetoed a bill to make companies test large AI models for their potential to help with mass attacks, reasoning that the bigger threat was overregulating an innovative industry. State agencies, meanwhile, struggled to enforce a law designed to help app workers.

2025 outlook

In 2025, California lawmakers must decide whether to accelerate their regulation of technology under Donald Trump's second presidential term; Trump has promised to rescind modest AI guardrails installed by the Biden administration and could use the technology to assist with mass deportations. This may include another crack at major AI curbs, given that the governor promised to take another swing at the problem following his veto of the testing bill.

Flooding Is a \$400 Billion Problem That's Getting Worse

Zeb Smathers thought he'd seen it all. Smathers is the mayor of Canton, N.C., which in 2021 suffered devastating floods that caused six deaths and \$300 million in damage. Two years later, the town's paper mill closed after more than a century in operation, removing 1,200 jobs from a community of just 4,400 people.

Canton is still being tested. After the floods, Smathers complained it was "crazy" that the mayor of a town roughly 3,000 feet above sea level had to keep an eye on tropical storm forecasts. Such vigilance, sadly, was not in vain. In September, Canton was slammed by rain from Hurricane Helene, which caused even greater damage than the 2021 storm. "There's only so much you can do when 28 feet of water comes to your hometown," Smathers said. "We were told this was a once-in-a-lifetime storm in 2021. Here we are, three years later."

It's cold comfort for the people of Canton but their situation, while extreme, is not unique. Everywhere rain can fall, it seems, flooding has gotten worse. Helene was a regionwide disaster across western counties in North Carolina. In June, hundreds of homes were damaged in Hawarden, Iowa, as the Big Sioux River rose to a record-breaking 39 feet. Climates as different as Vermont and New Mexico have seen repeated bouts of flooding this year. In August, intense rain led to hundreds of evacuations and two deaths near New Haven, Conn. "We are talking about rainfall in some areas in the 1,000-year level," said Brenda Bergeron, Connecticut's deputy emergency management commissioner.

There are many other examples in every corner of the nation. Flooding is the most dangerous and costly form of natural disaster. Already, estimated costs from flooding across the U.S. range as high as \$496 billion annually. If anything, the problem is getting worse. Record temperatures in oceans and surface

air mean more moisture in the atmosphere to fuel storms. The federal government's Fifth National Climate Assessment found that the amount of precipitation in the most severe rain events has increased dramatically in every part of the country over the past 50 years — as much as 60 percent in the Northeast, 45 percent in the Midwest and nearly 40 percent in the South.

The most extreme flood events will continue to grow in number and severity, says Daniel Swain, a UCLA scientist who studies the ways climate change is affecting weather. This will be the case even in places affected by drought. (While New Mexico experienced floods last June, it was simultaneously seeing wildfires.) "In a place like California, we may not ever see an increase in average precipitation, but it's extremely likely we'll still see a big increase in flood risk there because of increasingly extreme precipitation," Swain says. "In the Eastern Seaboard and the Deep South, we see an increase in both average and extreme precipitation."

Last year, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) reported that there's a nationwide need of \$115 billion for stormwater infrastructure investments between now and 2041. That represented a 385 percent increase over its 2012 projection, partly as a result of "an increase in the frequency and intensity of heavy precipitation events due to climate change." The infrastructure package passed by Congress in 2021 included several grant programs specifically to fund stormwater projects, but those add up to about 1 percent of the need identified by the EPA. Another \$1 billion is available through the Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities program, but that money isn't earmarked solely for stormwater projects.

After decades of deterioration in many cases, existing gray stormwater infrastructure — gutters, drains, stormwater channels and underground pipes — is inadequate. Almost all of it was built for a climate that no longer exists, Swain says. Engineers designing system upgrades can't rely on past storm patterns, but what lies ahead isn't yet in clear focus. The infrastructure law provided funding for the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) to update its atlas of community-level precipitation estimates to account for climate change, but this isn't expected to be complete until 2027.

There's more at stake than the immediate danger from floodwaters. There are long-term consequences when storm overflow carries pollutants into the water supply. Financing costs and insurance go up in communities where infrastructure can't meet the test of extreme precipitation. But, while the challenges are enormous, communities across the country are adapting their stormwater systems in ways that not only address flood concerns but create amenities such as parks and preserve more water for productive use.

It remains difficult to hit a moving target. Steve Parrish, chief engineer at the Clark County, Nev., flood control district, hired scientists from the University of Illinois to run multiple rainfall scenarios that incorporated climate change effects. Some indicated less rain, others an increase of as much as 50 percent. "How do you make a decision based on such a wide swath of results?" Parrish wonders.

Lacking a solid projection, the district is linking its infrastructure planning to the demands of a 100-year storm (a storm with a 1 percent chance of happening in any given year). This is common practice, but as NOAA Climate Service Manager Victor Murphy observes, it's certain that numbers will be higher once the agency's revised precipitation estimates are finalized. Rain at today's 100-year levels is likely to occur more often, and subsequent storms will be bigger. Clark County has invested \$2.5 billion based on the best data available to it, Parrish says. If climate change rewrites this data, that could mean expensive retrofits or even liability. "It's a lot of 'what ifs," he says. "It's really an issue to navigate."

Construction Jobs Increase In 234 Metro Areas Between November 2023 And Last Month, But Contractors May Have More Trouble Filling Jobs In 2025

Construction employment increased in 234, or 65 percent, of 358 metro areas between November 2023 and November 2024, according to an analysis by the Associated General Contractors of America of new government employment data. Association officials noted that firms continue to boost pay rates as many of them struggle to find enough qualified workers to hire.

"Although nearly two-thirds of metro areas have added construction workers in the past year, contractors report struggling to fill many hourly craft positions," said Ken Simonson, the association's chief economist. "These difficulties will be even greater in 2025 if the industry cannot access targeted workforce authorizations." Houston-The Woodlands-Sugar Land, Texas added the most construction jobs (16,100 jobs or 7 percent) between November 2023 and November 2024, followed by Northern Virginia (9,000 jobs or 11 percent); Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall, Fla. (6,100 jobs, 10 percent); Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford, Fla. (4,800 jobs, 5 percent); and Fort Worth-Arlington, Texas (4,200 jobs, 5 percent). Anchorage, Alaska had the largest percentage gain (17 percent, 1,800 jobs), followed by Fairbanks, Alaska (15 percent, 400 jobs); Detroit-Dearborn-Livonia, Mich. (15 percent, 3,800 jobs); Kahului-Wailuku-Lahaina, Hawaii (13 percent, 600 jobs); and Northern Virginia.

Construction employment declined over the year in 63 metro areas and was unchanged in 61 areas. The largest job loss occurred in New York City (-7,800 jobs, -5 percent), followed by Sacramento--Roseville--Arden-Arcade, Calif. (-4,700 jobs, -6 percent); Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro, Ore.-Wash. (-4,200 jobs, -5 percent); Phoenix-Mesa-Scottsdale, Ariz. (-3,700 jobs, -2 percent), and Chicago-Naperville-Arlington Heights, III. (-3,200 jobs, -2 percent). The largest percentage decrease occurred in Bloomington, III. (-11 percent, -400 jobs), followed by Bangor, Maine (-8 percent, -300 jobs), and 6 percent declines in Sacramento--Roseville--Arden-Arcade; San Jose-Sunnyvale-Santa Clara, Calif. (-3,100 jobs); Silver Spring-Frederic-Rockville, Md. (-1,800 jobs); and Duluth, Minn.-Wis. (-600 jobs).

Simonson noted that as more long-time construction workers reach retirement age, the industry has become more dependent on immigrants to fill craft positions. An analysis of data from the Census Bureau's American Community Survey shows roughly one-third of construction craft workers are foreign-born. Association officials said the biggest obstacle to recruiting new workers is the fact the federal government spends four times as much promoting four-year college degrees as it does careers in fields like construction. They urged lawmakers in Washington to close the funding gap by passing a Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act measure that boosts funding for training in fields like construction. And they said Washington officials need to double funding for the Carl D. Perkins Vocational & Technical Education Act.

"Relatively small boosts in federal funding for construction and other skills training will help put many more people into high-paying construction careers," said Jeffrey D. Shoaf, the association's chief executive officer.


