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California High-Speed Rail Investment Contributes Billions in Economic Benefit

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:

New economic data shows the California high-speed rail project is a proven job creator that lifts the local economies, particularly disadvantaged communities where over half of the project's investment occurred. In the Central Valley region alone, about \$9.6 billion in economic activity has benefited the region and its workers.

The California High-Speed Rail Authority (Authority) released its 2024 Economic Impact Analysis Report highlighting substantial benefits to the state and underscoring the project's role in stimulating economic growth as work continues to build the nation's first high-speed rail system.

Ninety-nine percent of the project's 2023-24 fiscal year expenditures have gone to California businesses and workers, with two out of every three dollars going to disadvantaged communities, driving substantial economic activity in these areas.

The Authority estimates the project has created approximately 109,000 job-years of employment, spurring more than \$8 billion in total labor income earned by workers on the project and nearly \$22 billion in total economic activity. A job-year is defined as the equivalent of a fulltime job for one year.

The Authority estimates completing the 171mile Merced to Bakersfield initial passenger service would, in addition to cutting existing trip times in half, add to these numbers, resulting in a total of 333,000 job-years of employment and total economic activity of \$70.3 billion.

Estimates show the complete build-out of the 494-mile Phase 1 System between San Francisco to Los Angeles/Anaheim, via the underway Central Valley section, would cumulatively create a total of 1,034,000 job-years of employment, and total economic activity of \$221.8 billion.

The Authority's economic impact analysis is updated annually and reflects data as of June 2024.

Construction Industry Must Attract 439,000 Workers in 2025

The construction industry will need to attract an estimated 439,000 net new workers in 2025 to meet anticipated demand for construction services, according to a proprietary model developed and released by Associated Builders and Contractors. In 2026, the industry will need to bring in 499,000 new workers as spending picks up in response to presumed lower interest rates.

"While the construction workforce has become younger and more plentiful in recent years, the industry still must attract 439,000 new workers in 2025 to balance supply and demand," said ABC Chief Economist Anirban Basu. "If it fails to do so, industrywide labor cost escalation will accelerate, exacerbating already high construction costs and reducing the volume of work that is financially feasible. Average hourly earnings throughout the industry are up 4.4% over the past 12 months, significantly outpacing earnings growth across all industries."

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PRSRT STD U.S. Postage PAID San Fran CA 941 Permit No. 820 ABC's proprietary model uses the historical relationship between inflation-adjusted construction spending growth, sourced from the U.S. Census Bureau's Construction Put in Place Survey, and payroll construction employment, sourced from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, to convert anticipated increases in construction outlays into demand for construction workers at a rate of approximately 3,550 jobs per billion dollars of additional spending. This model also incorporates the current level of job openings, unemployment and projected industry retirements and exits into its computations.

"This represents improved labor availability relative to recent years," said Basu. "The improvement can be traced to two primary factors. First, construction spending is expected to grow at its slowest pace in years throughout 2025, especially in interest rate-sensitive segments like homebuilding. Interest rates will remain elevated in 2025 before likely beginning to dip next year. Second, the industrywide workforce has become significantly younger over the past several quarters, with the median construction worker now younger than 42 for the first time since 2011. As a result, the pace of retirements is expected to slow this year. "Despite that improvement, contractors will struggle to fill open positions," said Basu. "This will be especially true in areas where manufacturing and data center megaprojects are underway. More than \$1 in every \$5 spent on nonresidential construction currently goes toward manufacturing projects, and those projects are absorbing a significant share of the labor force in their respective regions."

"The U.S. construction industry's efforts to hire more workers to replace retirees and meet the demand for new construction projects gained momentum in 2024," said Michael Bellaman, ABC president and CEO. "That is fantastic news, but we still have a long way to go to shore up the talent pipeline. The data on the number of young people choosing a career in construction suggests that employing practical technology and innovation in educational programs and on jobsites helps maximize the productivity and efficiency of the construction workforce. You have the best team with the suitable skill set and commitment to excellence- but why are your construction bids not working?

A good bidding strategy will increase your probability of landing the best projects and clients successfully. If your construction bids are hit or miss, you will not get as much work as you want. To come up with winning bids, you need to understand the construction process and refine your approach.

What is a construction bid

A construction bid is a process where a contractor submits a detailed proposal for a building project. The purpose of a bid is to showcase to an owner or client that the contractor is the best firm to undertake the particular project. The winning bidder will then be responsible for executing the necessary work on the project specified in their bid.

6 critical steps of the construction bidding process

The bidding process is like a job application or a resume. It gives an overview of your capabili-

ties to complete the work. If your first impression is impeccable, you will likely move to the interview phase.

As a contractor, you can find bid invitations from various sources.

The bidding process in the construction industry is highly regulated for government projects but can be less formal for private projects. However, it more or less follows the same procedure. The necessary steps are:

- Bid Solicitation
- Subcontracting
- Bid Submission
- Bid Selection
- Contract Formation
- Project Delivery

Let's discuss each of these bid stages.

1. Bid solicitation

This is where the project owner sends out a construction request for proposals (RFP) or an invitation for bid (IFB). For public projects, they are generally large and open invitations. This is when the project owner lays out the project requirements, specifies the construction contract type, and defines the delivery method. Public project bids are open to all qualified contractors who are registered to take on government projects. In these instances, government agencies strive to be as transparent as possible to give everyone a fair shot.

Meanwhile, private projects can either be open to all qualified contractors or sent to a smaller group. The former lets competition drive the bids, while the latter is often more exclusive and selective.

All that being said, bid packages for both public and private projects must contain key details including project specifications, delivery method, and insurance requirements. That way, contractors fully understand the project scope and compliance needs. The pricing for construction projects bids heavily determines the awarding of the contract. However, the bid solicitation phase requires more information, such as the request for qualification (RFQ). In retrospect, it is the method used to get as much information as necessary on the prospective contractors' company history.

2. Subcontracting

General contractors often have to outsource parts of the project to third parties. This process is known as subcontracting. For instance, if a project calls for specialized jobs like plumbing, electrical, etc., the general contractor would assign those areas to subcontractors who are focused on those specific components.

During these instances, the general contractor would still work with the owner and is responsible for overseeing the execution of the project.

3. Bid submission

The next step is the bid submission. This should include all the relevant company information. It has all the company's previous projects, management plans, and track record for completing tasks on time. The bid should be as accurate as possible.

It should also include a cost estimate based on the bill of quantities and blueprints. You can arrive at accurate costs using estimation software. Other things to include are overheads, labor, equipment, and materials. The best reasonable price influences the winning bid. It is important to note that a bid differs from an estimate, as discussed later.

The bid submission needs to have a professional touch. Remember, it's the face of the company.

and upskill them through both industry-driven and government-registered apprenticeship programs."

"There are also factors that could render this model overly conservative, meaning worker shortages could be more severe than predicted in 2025," said Basu. "While the consensus forecast has construction spending increasing by less than 3% in 2025, that same forecast has underestimated growth by a significant margin during each of the past three years. If inflation dissipates in coming months, borrowing costs will subside and construction volumes will increase. Faster-than-expected immigration over the past few years has also bolstered labor supply, and potential changes to immigration policy will likely constrain worker availability."

"Another solution to addressing the shortage is a merit-based, market-based visa system," said Bellaman. "ABC's goal is to work with the Trump administration and Congress to create a visa system that allows people who want to contribute to society and work legally in the construction industry to do so.

Trump doesn't understand California's complex water network. But that's not the point

Does Donald Trump truly believe the nonsense he spouts about California water — the mythical "valve" connecting the state to Canada, or the imagined "half-pipe" that stands ready to soak the Los Angeles area?

Does he honestly believe that "forest management" practices supposedly used in wet and chilly Finland or alpine Austria would have prevented the burning of California coastal sage scrub and the destruction of Altadena and Pacific Palisades?

Trump is both a master of strategic misdirection and a man who tends to believe what he finds advantageous to believe, facts notwithstanding. Either way, Trumpologists — those who specialize in deciphering him — generally advise examining his actions rather than his words.

Trump's actions took the form of a new executive order that crystalized his alliance with large and thirsty San Joaquin Valley agricultural interests and his contempt for the state's fishing industry, inland Delta cities, Indigenous tribes and natural resources. The order calls for overriding state environmental laws and reinterpreting federal laws like the Endangered Species Act that stand in the way of water transfers in times of drought to growers of crops like almonds and alfalfa.

To his credit, it includes support for displaced families in Southern California and North Carolina. But none of the clauses dealing with water have even the slightest bearing on the horrid fires, despite his repeated claims during his brief Los Angeles visit that the devastation was a result of bad water policy.

It's the orders — not his words — that are most consequential and that pose serious danger to California.

Yet Trump's wild verbal justifications for them are also worth examining, for two reasons. First, he's the president, and many Americans will accept his claims as true when they are not. That's a problem, because California does have serious water issues, including a decade-long drought interrupted by historic and deadly flooding. And we're on the verge of driving iconic species like migratory Chinook salmon into extinction and choking Stockton and other Delta cities with stagnant, saline, toxic water as snowmelt that historically runs through and replenishes their region is diverted for other uses.

Misidentifying the problem is like arresting the wrong person for serial murder or administering the wrong medication to treat a contagious disease. It provides the illusion that problems are being solved when, in fact, they are festering.

Trump's statements also provide valuable clues to the way he thinks.

Shape of the West

So let's consider the nonexistent valve, which he discussed during his campaign, and the needlessly empty half-pipe, a newer imponderable that he brought up at the Friday LA roundtable before issuing his order. In Trump's view, this imagined infrastructure lets "hundreds of millions of gallons of water flow down into Southern California" from the north, if only we'd let it.

How far north? Trump earlier spoke of Northern California, but by Friday he said the source was "the Pacific Northwest." By the end of the day he claimed the water flowed down — "naturally" — from Canada.

It flows so steadily from north to south, he said — and has been doing so for millions of years — that we don't even need reservoirs. If only we would turn the spigot, it would just keep coming.

That may be an almost accurate description of other river systems, like the Mississippi, which flows south from Minnesota near the Canadian border to the Gulf of Mexico (which Trump is renaming the "Gulf of America").

But the West isn't shaped like the central U.S., which slopes gently southward. In California, the low point is not at the bottom but in the middle — the Sacramento-San Joaquin River Delta. Inland rivers north of there flow south, but those to the south flow north. They don't cross the Tehachapis, which separate Southern California from the rest of the state.

The State Water Project, built in the 1960s, uses more electrical power than any other single project in the state to pump Northern California water south over the mountains. The transfer is anything but natural and requires dams to hold Sierra snowmelt and aqueducts to bring it to places it otherwise could never go.

Even if all that water did flow to Southern California, there would be nowhere to put it, at least not right now. The region currently has more water in storage than at any time in human history.

Does Trump believe that a far-fetched proposal by the late engineer Ralph Parsons to drain western Canada for the benefit of the western U.S. was actually built? Or the late Los Angeles County Supervisor Kenneth Hahn's plan to tap the Columbia River, or actor William Shatner's more recent but equally impractical pipeline from the same place?

They weren't built. They won't be.

Far more likely is a controversial tunnel to bring Sacramento River around, rather than through, the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta and to the California aqueduct. But after decades of debate, that comparatively small project hasn't been built either, at least not yet.

Forest management in a warmer planet

What about forest raking to prevent wildfire?

Since his first term, Trump has scolded California for not doing what he said the president of Finland once told him his country does (although the Finnish leader recalled no such conversation): raking the forest floor to keep things safe and tidy.

of guideway is completed and, of the 93 structures needed, 50 are complete and more than 25 are under construction between Madera, Fresno, Kings, Tulare and Kern counties. Earlier this month, the Authority announced the beginning of its railhead project in Kern County. Construction of the railhead is a major step in the track and systems process and signifies the next phase of the high-speed rail program. It includes the installation of temporary freight tracks that will help transport materials needed to build the future electrified, high-speed rail tracks. The railhead project is possible due to the completion of Construction Package 4, which is comprised of 22 miles and 11 structures.

Since the start of high-speed rail construction, the project has created more than 14,500 construction jobs, mostly going to Central Valley residents.

The Authority has full environmental clearance on 463 miles of the high-speed rail program from the Bay Area to downtown Los Angeles.

You also need to cover your bases and show the client you've thought through every detail of the project. When bidding for construction projects, this level of thoroughness often makes all the difference.

As such, when producing a contractor bid, you need to generate estimates for costs like:

- **Labor:** Construction labor costs includes wages for the crew needed to complete the project, factoring in both skilled and unskilled labor.
- **Materials:** These are the physical resources required, like concrete, wood, and steel. Material costs can fluctuate, so it's essential to get up-to-date prices to keep the estimate reliable.
- **Overhead:** Overhead covers the indirect costs of doing business, like office expenses, insurance, and permits. These costs ensure the project stays compliant and the company remains operational throughout.
- **Equipment:** This includes machinery and tools required for the project, whether they're rented or owned. Estimating equipment costs helps avoid surprises and keeps the project timeline on track.

As such, you may be required to submit a bid bond when bidding construction projects—especially if they're government or large private contracts.

4. Bid selection

There are rules, especially in government projects, to ensure that the lowest bidder wins the contract. This rules out any fraud or biases in awarding the contract so that price is eventually the ultimate equalizer.

However, there is more leeway to consider other factors when choosing a winning bid on private projects. Some of these factors include:

- **Experience and track record:** The project owner may look at the contractor's experience with similar projects and their history of completing work on time and within budget. A solid track record demonstrates reliability and expertise—both of which can be just as valuable as competitive pricing.
- Quality and reputation: A contractor known for high-quality work and strong client relationships may be prioritized, even if their bid isn't the absolute lowest. That's because a reputation for quality can imply fewer issues and a smoother project experience for the client.
- Financial stability: Contractors with a strong financial foundation are often pre-

ferred, as they are more likely to handle unexpected project costs without compromising quality or timelines.

- **Safety record:** A proven commitment to safety can be a deciding factor, especially in industries where compliance and accident prevention are critical. A strong safety record demonstrates professionalism and can reduce project risks.
- **Timeline and availability:** Clients may also prioritize contractors who can commit to their preferred timeline. Flexibility to start the project on schedule and finish within the agreed-upon timeframe can be a significant advantage.
- **Innovative solutions and value-added services:** Contractors who offer creative solutions or extra services, like sustainable building practices or extended warranties, can stand out. These added benefits may align with the client's goals, adding further value beyond the bid price.

What is bid leveling?

Bid leveling is the process of comparing and evaluating multiple bids to ensure they align in scope and pricing, making it easier to identify the best option. During bid leveling, the project owner reviews each bid to account for differences in labor, materials, timelines, and scope. Doing so helps ensure an "apples-to-apples" comparison. This step helps clarify any inconsistencies or omissions in bids, which can prevent unexpected costs or project issues later.

5. Contract negotiation and formation

Once the owner selects a bid, they'll move on to the contract negotiation and formation stage. Here, the owner and contractors would come up



with an agreement and produce a formal docu- • D

ment outlining the terms of the project. Construction contracts come in different forms,

including:

- **Cost-Plus Contract**, where contractors are compensated for all construction-related expenses.
- **Design-Build Contract**, which handles design and construction costs at the same time.
- **Guaranteed Maximum Price Contract,** which stipulates a maximum and capped amount of what the owner will pay the contractor.
- **Incentive Construction Contract**, where the owner releases agreed-upon payments once specific milestones are met.
- Integrated Project Delivery Contract, which involves multiple parties—the owner, builder, and design firm.
- Lump-Sum Contract, wherein the contractor agrees to deliver the project at a preset price.
- **Time and Materials Contract**, which stipulates an agreed-upon price based on profit rate, materials, and time spent on the project.
- Unit Price Contract, where the owner pays the contractor based on the units at agreed-upon rates.

6. Project Delivery Selection

The owner and contractor will also agree on a project delivery method. Depending on what the project entails, the team may decide to choose one of the following:

Design-Bid-Build (DBB), which follows a traditional sequential process. With DBB, the architect designs a project before the bidding stage starts. Once a bid is selected,

- the team will move on to the building stage.
 Design-Build (DB), where the design and construction of the project are handled by one firm. Some consider DB as a more straightforward delivery method. However, owners may have less input in design and
- Construction Management at Risk (CMAR) brings in a construction manager (CM) who serves as a consultant to the owner. The CM manages the subcontractors and takes on the responsibilities (and risks) of meeting milestones and completing the project at the promised price.

construction management.

- Multi-Prime (MP) divides the project into three phases: design, engineering, and construction. With MP, there are separate contracts with the stakeholder at different project stages. This means the owner has separate agreements with GCs, trade contractors, etc.
- Integrated Project Delivery (IPD) emphasizes teamwork and shared liability. This delivery method puts the owner, designer, and general contractor under one contract and spreads responsibilities, risks, and rewards across all parties.

CalChamber Celebrates Contributions of Hispanic Businesses

Latinos in the United States are an economic powerhouse, contributing trillions in gross domestic product (GDP) each year.

In fact, if U.S. Latinos were a standalone country, they would rank as the fifth largest GDP in the world—larger than India, Russia, Canada, England and other major economies, according to the latest report by the Latino Donor Collaborative (LDC) in partnership with Wells Fargo. Projections show that the U.S. Latino economy will surpass Germany's GDP by 2027.

Economic Contributions

In California, there are more than 815,000 Hispanic-owned businesses, creating more than 500,000 jobs, according to the California Hispanic Chambers of Commerce (CAHCC). These businesses contribute more than \$100 billion in annual revenue to the state's economy.

U.S. Latino GDP was \$3.6 trillion in 2022, according to the most recent data available. The growth trajectory of U.S. Latino GDP was the second fastest-growing among the world's 10 largest economies between 2017 and 2022, with a 4.6% annual average real growth rate, coming in second to China (5.3%). According to the LDC, the U.S. Latino economy is expected to continue expanding faster than most first-world economies, supported by population growth, youth, business formation, improvements in educational attainment, and general upward mobility.

The U.S. Latino economy enjoyed robust growth between 2021 and 2022. U.S. Latino GDP increased by \$321 billion to \$3.6 trillion. Gross Domestic Income (GDI) added \$316 billion to \$2.83 trillion, while U.S. Latino Purchasing Power (LPP) rose by \$338 billion to \$3.78 trillion. From 2017 to 2022, U.S. Latino GDP increased on average by 4.6% annually. That was 2.6 times the rate of the rest of the economy. U.S. Latino GDI and LPP both increased on average by 4.8% per year, which was 2.7 times and 2.5 times faster than the rest of the economy, respectively. Furthermore, the Latino cohort was responsible for 28.3% of total additions to national GDP over that time period.

Industries Driving Growth

In 2022, manufacturing was the biggest driver of U.S. Latino economic growth, which reached \$457.4 billion, a 48.4% year-over-year increase. U.S. Latinos in 2022 accounted for 17% of the nation's total manufacturing.

Retail trade also contributed substantially to the growth of the U.S. Latino economy, with a 14.1% increase to \$270.3 billion, representing 16% of the United States total. Similarly, construction reported a 9.3% increase to \$250.3 billion, or a 23% nationwide share.

U.S. Latino Workforce, Entrepreneurship

Latinos make up about 19% of the U.S. workforce and have the highest work participation rate among all major groups of the U.S. population. While the rest of the economy saw a decrease of 1.3 million working-age individuals between 2021 and 2022, the U.S. Latino cohort added 1.4 million workers, offsetting the national loss.

Latinos do not simply contribute to the economy as workers, they also play a key role in driving U.S. entrepreneurship. The latest Stanford University State of Latino Entrepreneurship research report found that between 2007 and 2022, the number of Latino-owned businesses grew by 57% nationwide. Latinos own nearly 5 million businesses, generating more than \$800 billion in annual revenue.

U.S. Latinos owned 10% of all accommodation and food services businesses nationally in 2021, 6% of all health care and social assistance firms, 11% of administrative and other services firms, and 12.2% of all construction firms, according to the LDC. These were the four largest U.S. industries by number of workers in 2021.

They are committed to the quality and durability of their products, as well as reusing resources, efficiency in their building, and supporting local businesses.

Metro Lighting is 100% solar-powered by a 21kWh solar array on the roof of their building. This system reduced Metro Lighting's energy expenses immediately will pay for itself in eight to nine years, and is an investment that will save over \$12,000 a year in electricity bills. The estimated annual production of their solar array is 27,397 kWh, which translates to an estimated 32,876 pounds of CO2 avoided per year. This is especially impressive for a business that requires a lot of power to showcase lighting. The extraordinary feature of rooftop solar is central to their environmental leadership amongst peers in the lighting industry.

Metro Lighting implements an "Environmentally Preferable Purchasing Policy." This Policy includes reducing waste at the source, buying recycled content products, saving energy, water, and other natural resources, avoiding toxics, contracting services from

Capitola Veterinary Hospital is a full-service veterinary medical facility that has become an ecofriendly center for all pets and clients. They have taken a number of significant actions to reduce their carbon footprint over the years. For example, they have eliminated paper use by converting to paperless medical records, invested in a paperless fax machine, and retrofitted all of their old fluorescent tubes with high efficiency LED tubes and T8 tubes. To further their resource conservation efforts, they have also converted their X-rays from film to digital, reducing the amount of chemical and hazardous material waste produced as a result. For these actions, Capitola Veterinary Hospital was presented with a CoolCalifornia Small Business Climate Leader Award in 2013.

In 2014, Capitola Veterinary Hospital continued to find opportunities to enhance their business in order to become even more eco-friendly. They partnered with Arcadia Power to purchase 100 percent clean energy for their electrical usage in the form of wind power Renewable Energy Credits, also known as RECs. They also created a clean energy incentive program for their clients, providing them with gift certificates to their
