

Commerce Department Announces New Industry Voluntary Pledge to Bring more Women into Construction Industry

The U.S. Department of Commerce announced the Million Women in Construction Community Pledge to bring more women into the construction workforce -- as well as several leading construction companies that have signed on to the Pledge. These companies are Baker Construction, Gilbane Building Company, McKisack & McKisack, Mortenson, Power Design, Shawmut Design and Construction, and Suffolk. In addition, U.S. Secretary of Commerce Gina Raimondo is making an industry-wide call for more companies, unions, and training organizations to sign on to the Pledge.

By signing on to the Million Women in Construction Community Pledge, leaders in the industry are demonstrating an ongoing commitment to increase women's access to training, jobs and leadership opportunities. This follows an announcement made earlier this month launching the CHIPS Women in Construction Framework. Construction companies, unions, and training organizations can join the initiative by pledging to focus on or scale up equitable hiring and workforce development efforts that create broader pipelines and opportunities for women. This industry-wide call to action encourages signers to voluntarily take action by utilizing best practices, including building community partnerships to reach women and girls,



investing in solutions that increase supportive services such as child care, and fostering safe, healthy, and respectful workplaces.

“President Biden’s Investing in America agenda is creating a construction boom all over the country, and with that boom comes a huge increase in jobs and opportunities for workers in construction and the trades. But right now, wom-

en make up less than 11% of jobs in construction and only 4% in skilled trades. Many of these are good-paying, quality jobs you can get without a college degree, and women deserve equal opportunity for these jobs,” said Secretary Raimondo. “If we’re going to meet this moment, we need more women in the construction, and we need an industry-wide commitment, which is why I’m calling on everyone – contractors, labor unions,

training organizations – to join our Community Pledge to commit to solutions and support proven strategies that help overcome barriers faced by women and underserved communities in construction and the trades.”

The announcement comes after a roundtable of construction industry leaders, convened by The

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High-Speed Rail Releases Spring 2024 Construction Update

The California High-Speed Rail Authority (Authority) has released its Spring 2024 Progress Report highlighting continued progress being made on California’s high-speed rail project, including work on the Central Valley system’s largest construction site, the Hanford Viaduct.

Located in Kings County, workers continue to build the superstructure and deck of the elevated structure that will carry electrified high-speed

trains and will connect to the future Kings/Tulare Station.

Other highlights include work at the Belmont Avenue Grade Separation in the city of Fresno, Tied Arch Bridge in Fresno County, Tule River Viaduct in Tulare County, and the clean-up of an old farmworker housing facility in Kern County.

Since the start of construction, the Authority has created more than 13,000 construction jobs, a majority going to residents from the Central Valley. This includes 4,296 that have gone to

Mayor Bass, SBA Administrator Guzman Launch Women's Business Center in South LA

Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass and U.S. Small Business Administration Administrator Isabel Casillas Guzman joined the launch of the first federally recognized Women's Business Center at the Vermont Slauson Economic Development Corporation (VSEDC) in South Los Angeles to help small businesses start, grow and develop in the city. Mayor Bass highlighted the strong partnership that Los Angeles has with the federal government and emphasized her administration's work to open Los Angeles for business by making more resources like what the new Women's Business Center offers available to more people.

"I have worked with Vermont Slauson Economic Development Corporation for years and have seen firsthand the positive impact the organization is making for small businesses and their contributions to the South Los Angeles community," said Mayor Bass. "Together with VSEDC and organizations like it, we are working to open the city for business and make sure that City Hall is an advocate, not a barrier, to helping small businesses grow and thrive. I want to thank the Small Business Administration and Administrator Guzman for the continued partnership and for awarding VSEDC with this significant, very well-deserved distinction."



Today's opening continues action taken this week to support businesses in Los Angeles. Earlier this week, Mayor Bass announced that the City is making more resources available to support small businesses through LA Optimized 2.0, a program to help small businesses build and strengthen their digital presence and LAprenuer, a new online learning platform created to equip entrepreneurs with key skills and information to succeed.

Yesterday, Mayor Bass encouraged residents, small business owners and other Angelenos who were impacted to apply for the low-interest disaster loans through the U.S. Small Business Administration that were recently made available following Mayor Bass' calls for federal support.

The release of new resources follows the fourth installment of the Los Angeles Region Small Business Summit, an ongoing partnership between the City and County of Los Angeles that drew more than 500 small business owners and entrepreneurs. The Mayor continues to make

progress opening Los Angeles for business by expanding City departments' services for small businesses and improving the experience of doing business with the City.

Last year, Mayor Bass issued Executive Directive 4 which directed comprehensive action at City Hall to support the creation, development and growth of small businesses through convenings like this Summit and improving the way City departments engage with small businesses.

U.S. Secretary of Commerce Gina Raimondo Announces Order to Harness Potential of America's Workforce

U.S. Secretary of Commerce Gina M. Raimondo announced a Department Administrative Order (DAO) to establish a Department of Commerce workforce policy agenda focused on preparing workers with the education and skills necessary to accelerate the development and deployment of critical and emerging technologies, which are critical to U.S. economic competitiveness and national security. The DAO frames a Commerce approach to workforce investments that is employer-led, worker-centric, and fully integrated into

the Department's historic work through the Biden-Harris Investing in America agenda.

"America is the most competitive country in the world, and that's because of the strength of our workforce. But if we want to stay ahead, we need to ensure we are empowering our workers with the skills they need to secure the good-paying jobs we're creating under President Biden's Investing in America agenda," said Secretary Raimondo. "The diversity of our workforce is our greatest asset, and to make our country even more competitive, we can't have any Americans stuck in the margins of our economy. The order I'm announcing today highlights how the De-

partment of Commerce is investing more than \$1.6 billion in our workforce and the support services needed to upskill and connect workers with family sustaining jobs in their communities in key industries that will keep the United States at the forefront of our 21st-century economy."

The DAO cements two sets of principles that have guided the Department's workforce development programs. First, the DAO establishes Principles for Workforce Investments. These reflect the employer-led, worker-centric approach to the Department's workforce development programs as first developed under the Good Jobs Challenge and are guid-

ing workforce program development across the Department.

Second, through the Good Jobs Principles, the DAO helps ensure the Department's programs support the creation of goods jobs as a building block for equitable economic growth. Developed jointly with the Department of Labor, the Good Jobs Principles provide a framework for workers, businesses, labor unions, advocates, researchers, state and local governments, and Federal agencies for a shared vision of job quality.

The Authority has begun work to extend the 119 miles currently under construction to 171 miles of future electrified high-speed rail from Merced to Bakersfield. There are currently more than

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: The Governor’s revised budget proposal closes both this year’s remaining \$27.6 billion budget shortfall and next year’s projected \$28.4 billion deficit while preserving many key services that Californians rely on — including education, housing, health care, and food assistance.

Governor Gavin Newsom released a May Revision proposal for the 2024-25 fiscal year that ensures the budget is balanced over the next two fiscal years by tightening the state’s belt and stabilizing spending following the tumultuous COVID-19 pandemic, all while preserving key ongoing investments.

Under the Governor’s proposal, the state is projected to achieve a positive operating reserve balance not only in this budget year but also in the next. This “budget year, plus one” proposal is designed to bring longer-term sta-

bility to state finances without delay and create an operating surplus in the 2025-26 budget year.

In the years leading up to this May Revision, the Newsom Administration recognized the threats of an uncertain stock market and federal tax deadline delays – setting aside \$38 billion in reserves that could be utilized for shortfalls. That has put California in a strong position to maintain fiscal stability.

Even when revenues were booming, we were preparing for possible downturns by investing in reserves and paying down debts – that’s put us in a position to close budget gaps while protecting core services that Californians depend on. Without raising taxes on Californians, we’re delivering a balanced budget over two years that continues the progress we’ve fought so hard to achieve, from getting folks off the streets to addressing the climate crisis to keeping our communities safe.

Below are the key takeaways from Governor Newsom’s proposed budget:

A BALANCED BUDGET OVER TWO YEARS. The Governor is solving two years of budget problems in a single budget, tightening the state’s belt to get the budget back to normal after the tumultuous years of the COVID-19 pandemic. By addressing the shortfall for this budget year — and next year — the Governor is eliminating the 2024-25 deficit and eliminating a projected deficit for the 2025-26 budget year that is \$27.6 billion (after taking an early budget action) and \$28.4 billion respectively.

CUTTING SPENDING, MAKING GOVERNMENT LEANER. Governor Newsom’s revised balanced state budget cuts one-time spending by \$19.1 billion and ongoing spending by \$13.7 billion through 2025-26. This includes a nearly 8% cut to state operations and a targeted elimination of 10,000 unfilled state positions, improving government efficiency and reducing non-essential spending — without raising taxes on individuals or proposing state worker

furloughs. The budget makes California government more efficient, leaner, and modern — saving costs by streamlining procurement, cutting bureaucratic red tape, and reducing redundancies.

PRESERVING CORE SERVICES & SAFETY NETS. The budget maintains service levels for key housing, food, health care, and other assistance programs that Californians rely on while addressing the deficit by pausing the expansion of certain programs and decreasing numerous recent one-time and ongoing investments.

NO NEW TAXES & MORE RAINY DAY SAVINGS. Governor Newsom is balancing the budget by getting state spending under control — cutting costs, not proposing new taxes on hardworking Californians and small businesses — and reducing the reliance on the state’s “Rainy Day” reserves this year.

Governor Hochul Highlights Over \$120 Million for Local Water Infrastructure Projects Across New York State

Governor Kathy Hochul today announced that the Environmental Facilities Corporation Board of Directors has approved over \$120 million in financial assistance for water infrastructure improvement projects across New York State. The Board's approval authorizes municipal access to low-cost financing and previously announced grants to get shovels in the ground for critical water and sewer infrastructure projects, including treatment processes to remove emerging contaminants from drinking water.

"Improving our water infrastructure is essential for building safe and healthy communities throughout New York," Governor Hochul said. "This financial assistance makes all the difference in being able to provide safe drinking water to New Yorkers, protect our natural resources and ensure the projects are successful and affordable."

The funding approved today includes significant investments from the federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) and the state's Water Infrastructure Improvement (WIIA) grant program. The Village of Coxsackie in Greene County, Dutchess County Water and Wastewater Authority, Franklin Square Water District in Nassau County, and Village of Gowanda in Cattaraugus County will receive funding from both BIL and WIIA for projects that will safeguard drinking water and significantly improve water quality. BIL funding was also awarded to the Town of Yorkshire in Cattaraugus County.

Environmental Facilities Corporation President & CEO Maureen A. Coleman said, "Under the leadership of Governor Hochul, New York State continues to deploy funding from the federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Law faster than any other state in the nation. The coupling

of federal grants with state grants is making a difference between a community in dire need of new water infrastructure and that community constructing and completing new infrastructure. Communities are encouraged to apply for the latest round of State water grants before the June 14 deadline."

New York State Department of Environmental Conservation Interim Commissioner Sean Mahar said, "Investments in water infrastructure are essential to economic development in communities across the state and the more than \$120 million announced today will provide local municipalities access to the tools they need to plan, construct, and implement essential improvements to clean water and drinking water infrastructure. The DAO sets as departmental policy that economic development and workforce development are inextricably linked. Therefore, the Departmental should prioritize the expansion, creation, and coordination of regional clusters in tandem with modern workforce development strategies.

The DAO lays out the Department's three-part approach to its meet employers' need for talent and to connect Americans to good jobs:

1. **Invest in employer-driven education and training systems;**
2. **Foster transformative employer practices, and;**
3. **Produce timely data to help Americans develop and advance.**

Finally, the DAO establishes the Commerce Workforce Council to develop and implement the Department's workforce policy, programs, and initiatives and coordinate with other federal

agencies. The DAO charges the council with conducting an annual inventory of programs, funding, and personnel; setting metrics and goals on the aggregate outcomes of the Department's programs; and publishing an annual report on its activities.
