California wants to be carbon-neutral by 2045. What does that mean for its big economic drivers?

California's governor, Gavin Newsom, flew more 6,000 miles to Rome this month to deliver a brief speech on climate change at a Vatican-sponsored conference.

Media reports of Newsom's appearance centered on his verbal potshot at former President Donald Trump and his conversation with Pope Francis who, Newsom said, praised his unilateral suspension of executions in California.

However, the governor did devote a little time to climate change, mostly reiterating his villainization of the oil industry.

"It's because of the burning of gas, the burning of coal, the burning of oil," Newsom said. "We have the tools. We have the technology. We have the capacity to address the issue at a global scale and they've been fighting every single advancement and we have got to call that out."

At this point, we should remind ourselves that Newsom's constant gallivanting to polish his image as a political heavyweight depends on planes and automobiles that burn petroleum. Nevertheless, he has proclaimed that California will by 2045, just 21 years hence, become carbon emission-neutral

In 2022, the state Air Resources Board issued a "scoping plan" with multiple precise steps to achieve the goal. Newsom hailed it as "a comprehensive roadmap to achieve a pollution-free future" and, with characteristic hyperbole, "the most ambitious set of climate goals of any jurisdiction in the world ... (that could) spur an economic transformation akin to the industrial revolution."

That's a lot to be done in just a couple of decades, and there's not been a particularly noticeable amount of progress. In fact, there's been some regression.

It's questionable whether California will have enough power from solar panels and windmills not only to fill current demand but supply additional juice for the many millions of batterypowered cars and trucks that the plan envisions.

Fearing blackouts, Newsom pressed to keep some natural gas-fired power plants and the state's only nuclear-powered plant operating past their planned phaseout dates. Electric car sales have languished, even though automakers are supposed to quit selling gasoline- and diesel-powered vehicles in just 11 years. Car buyers are

leery because the state still has only a fraction of the recharging stations conversion requires.

Furthermore, to deal with a budget crisis, Newsom has slashed spending on climate change programs.

BOE Adopts \$154.8 Billion in State-Assessed Property Values for Fiscal Year 2024-25

By The California State Board of Equalization (BOE)

The California State Board of Equalization (BOE) unanimously adopted the \$154.8 billion in state-assessed property values of 321 companies within California, which include telephone, gas, and electric companies, independent power producers, regulated railroads, and intercounty pipelines. In the upcoming fiscal year, California's schools and local communities will receive approximately \$2.5 billion in property tax revenue resulting from the BOE fulfilling one of its core constitutional functions.

"The BOE sets property values for state-assessed properties annually, generating critically needed tax dollars for schools and local communities," said BOE Chair Sally J. Lieber. "As a result, essential services across the state, including schools, public safety services, safety net programs, and infrastructure, will receive funding."

While most property in California is assessed by County Assessors, the BOE is required by the California Constitution to directly assess certain public utilities, regulated railroads, and intercounty pipelines throughout the state. These properties are not subject to Proposition 13, and the BOE must annually determine the unitary property's fair market value, including improve-

ments, personal property, and land. The BOE develops the fair market value by considering market conditions, income generated by the property, replacement costs, investments in the property, regulatory climate, depreciation, and other factors as of the January 1 lien date.

For fiscal year 2024-25, the total value increased by 6.2% from last year or \$9.1 billion, generating approximately \$148 million in additional tax dollars. County governments will use the values set by the BOE to levy local property taxes.

About BOI

The California State Board of Equalization (BOE) is the only elected tax board in the coun-

try, and it is comprised of four Equalization District Members and the State Controller. Since 1879, the BOE's constitutional and statutory duties include the oversight of the 58 County Assessors to ensure assessment practices are uniform and consistent statewide. In addition, the BOE directly assesses the property of regulated railroads and certain public utilities, collects the Private Railroad Car Tax, and is responsible for the Alcoholic Beverage Tax and Tax on Insurers. BOE's critical role in property tax administration by promoting fair and equitable assessments protects the tax dollars that schools, local communities, and the State of California depend on every day.

One of the biggest unknowns about a carbonneutral future, however, is the impact on economic sectors that depend on transportation. A new report on one of those sectors, Southern California's logistics industry, frames the issue.

A half-century ago, Southern California's leaders bet the region's future on the twin ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach becoming the nation's primary conduit for trade with Asia, and the transportation and warehousing facilities to handle cargo.

The new report from the California Center for Jobs and the Economy, an offshoot of the California Business Roundtable, reveals how impressively that goal has been achieved.

What it terms the "regional trade cluster" is the region's largest single source of employment, supporting 1.85 million jobs, two-thirds of which require only a high school education or

less – an important characteristic given its huge immigrant population.

However, global transportation is a cutthroat business and the twin ports have seen their traffic decline in recent years due to competition from ports with lower operational costs. The sector is also being pressed by state and local authorities to convert ships, trucks, locomotives and other machinery to low- or no-emission propulsion, at huge cost. There has been a backlash against the massive warehouse complexes in inland areas.

Can the industry undergo the massive conversion Newsom's plan envisions in just 21 years – without becoming terminally uncompetitive and shedding the jobs on which so many of the region's families depend?

It's a microcosm of the larger uncertainty.

Governor Kathy Hochul today unveiled New York's first-ever Youth Workers Bill of Rights, first announced in her 2024 State of the State address as part of an effort to bolster protections for New York's youngest workers. Governor Hochul tasked the New York State Department of Labor with developing and distributing the Youth Workers Bill of Rights in partnership with the New York State Education Department and creating a vital resource that details essential rights and protections for every youth worker. The Youth Workers Bill of Rights builds on the Governor's commitment to addressing last year's troubling rise in child labor violations and protecting young people in the workplace.

"Every worker in our state deserves a fair, safe work environment, especially our young people," Governor Hochul said. "My administration is taking action to ensure that our youngest workers feel empowered, protected, and well-informed, and by fulfilling my State of the State commitment to creating our first-ever Youth Workers Bill of Rights, we are continuing to make strides toward making New York the safest and most worker-friendly state in the nation."

Written in clear and accessible language, the Youth Workers Bill of Rights seeks to educate first time workers as they prepare to enter the labor market by explaining the rights all NY workers enjoy as well as the protections that are specific to workers under 18. The Bill of Rights will be distributed to every young worker upon receiving their working papers. It will be available in various formats, including a print pocket guide available in schools and NYSDOL Career Centers for easy reference a downloadable poster for educators and administrative staff to hang in schools, and online for broad accessibility.

Key protections outlined include the right to:

- The minimum wage
- A safe and discrimination-free workplace
- File a complaint without fear of retaliation

The Youth Workers Bill of Rights is available online at NYSDOL's new Youth Worker Information Hub. This hub seeks to be an educational resource for young people as they prepare to enter the workforce. The hub includes important information regarding protections for young people including permitted working hours during the school day, how to be sure they are being paid the correct minimum wage, and a full list of prohibited occupations for children under the age of 18.

The Youth Workers Bill of Rights follows the Protect Youth Workers Pledge for businesses, launched in 2023 under direction from Governor Hochul. By taking the pledge, businesses affirm they will always consider the safety and wellbeing of minors, they will report suspected child labor violations to the Child Labor Taskforce, and that they have educated their employees on labor rights and signs of labor trafficking.

Protecting Youth Workers in New York State

In 2023, Governor Hochul announced a series of measures to combat a rise in child labor violations and labor trafficking after a disturbing 68 percent spike in reports of child labor violations in 2022. The measures included the creation of an interagency Child Labor Task Force, the launch of an Employer Pledge program for employers committed to educat-

ing their employees on labor rights, and the creation of a new Labor Trafficking Response Unit at NYSDOL to support and protect victims of labor trafficking.

Since 2023, NYSDOL's Labor Standards team has conducted more than 300 targeted inspections at businesses employing youth workers. The inspections were conducted primarily at food service, retail, and seasonal businesses, uncovering numerous violations related to employment certificates, prohibited hours, and posting of hours. The Labor Standards team collaborates with these businesses to ensure compliance and distributes educational materials developed in conjunction with Child Labor Task Force, which remains dedicated to ongoing education and enforcement to combat child labor statewide.

With the summer months approaching, young people are filling out applications and obtaining their working papers to start summer jobs. Increased public awareness about youth worker rights and protections helps keep the state's newest workers safe. As New York continues to lead in promoting labor rights, the Youth Workers Bill of Rights stands as a testament to the state's dedication to creating a safe, inclusive, and fair work environment for all.
