California Invests Nearly \$2 Billion to Improve and Protect the State's Transportation Infrastructure

The California Transportation Commission (CTC) today allocated \$1.9 billion to support transportation infrastructure projects that play a starring role in powering the world's fifth largest economy. The approved funding provides significant investments for bridges, roadways, transit, and improved facilities for people who walk and bike.

The latest allocations also include nearly \$430 million from the federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021 (IIJA) and \$740 million via Senate Bill (SB) 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017.

Among the efforts spurred by today's \$1.9 billion commitment include several projects prioritizing the state's vital bridge network, highlighted by \$27.6 million for the Interstate 405 improvement project in Los Angeles County, more than \$4 million to repair bridge damage along Interstate 80 in Alameda County, and \$600,000 to replace the Ackerman Creek Bridge in Mendocino County.

Also included are projects that will build or renovate shoreline embankments, bus, bicycle, and pedestrian infrastructure, and railroad overcrossings.

"California's transportation infrastructure is critical to the economic and cultural lifeblood of our state, and this funding provides key support in our mission to provide a safe, equitable and sustainable transportation system for all users," said Caltrans Director Tony Tavares.

The latest CTC-approved projects include:

Alameda County

\$50,000 allocation on I-80 to reconstruct the I-80/Ashby Avenue (SR-13) Interchange and provide bicycle/pedestrian connectivity.



\$7.5 million allocation on SR-84 In and near Fremont and Union City, from 0.3 mile north of Route 238 (Mission Boulevard) to 1.5 miles north of Palomares Road to repair slopes and wire mesh screening, reconstruct roadway, and construct new retaining wall. A severe storm on February 19, 2024, resulted in embankment slope failing, causing the roadway shoulder to collapse.

\$8.8 million allocation on I-580 near Livermore at 1.0 mile east of Flynn Road. Heavy rains up until March 15, 2023, caused a landslide below a retaining wall, causing the wall to buckle and fail. This project will stabilize the slope, excavate, and remove the damaged retaining wall, construct a new retaining wall system, replace damaged pavement, and apply erosion control.

\$4.2 million allocation on I-880 in Oakland, under Route 880 along Wood Street, between West Grand Avenue and 34th Street. People experiencing homelessness have been using this bridge structure for shelter. This site is a large unsheltered encampment where fires occur on a regular basis and has resulted in fires damaging the bridge columns. This project is necessary to

repair bridge damage, protect the area by constructing a hardened security perimeter fence, perform electrical repairs, reconstruct, and stabilize the damaged embankment slopes, and install signs.

Governor Hochul Announces Pause on Congestion Pricing to Address the Rising Cost of Living in New York

Governor Kathy Hochul addressed New Yorkers on affordability and the cost of living and directed the MTA to indefinitely pause congestion pricing to avoid added burdens to working- and middle-class families.

State Senator Monica R. Martinez said, "I applaud the decision by Governor Hochul to hit the brakes by indefinitely placing a pause on the implementation of congestion pricing and the toll it would have on our Long Island residents. Though I recognize and support the need to reduce emissions for the health of our region, this goal must not be achieved by driving residents, businesses, and workers out of the city. I hope this pause will allow time to switch gears toward a more workable solution for Manhattan's traffic woes."

State Senator Jessica Scarcella-Spanton said, "Governor Hochul indefinitely stopping the implementation of congestion pricing is a significant win for our constituents. We have been voicing our concerns about this program since its inception, and I'm glad that Governor Hochul has taken the concerns I have brought to her into consideration before congestion pricing was set to go into effect later this month. The health, financial security, and overall well-being of my constituents on Staten Island and in Southern Brooklyn are my top priorities, which is why I fought against this congestion pricing plan from the moment it was first announced. From introducing legislation for exemptions to this program to joining the lawsuit to stop it in its tracks, I have been steadfast in my opposition all along. The adverse health effects and the financial burden it would have placed on my constituents should have always outweighed the potential tax revenue for New York."

State Senator Joseph P. Addabbo Jr. said, "While I understand the program's intent to re-

duce traffic congestion, improve air quality, and financially support our public transit system. I had concerns about the impact on New Yorkers residing in transit deserts with no viable transportation option into Manhattan other than by car. Congestion pricing would impose heavy financial burdens on taxi drivers, truck drivers, the elderly, the infirm, and the disabled community. Additionally, restaurants, theaters, concert halls, and an entire business ecosystem dependent on financial support from outer-borough residents and visitors would suffer as people are deterred from visiting the city. I believe that delaying the implementation of the Central Business District Tolling Program would allow residents and tourists to better prepare for this unwarranted expense, as we continue recovering from the COVID-19 pandemic and inflation. I applaud the Governor for recognizing the widespread consequences this program would present for residents, businesses, and tourists.'

Assemblymember Manny De Los Santos said, "Leadership is about doing the right thing even when tough. That's why I'm so glad governor Hochul is standing up for low- and middleincome families by pausing congestion pricing. With inflation higher than it's been in a generation, New Yorkers can't afford yet another hit to our wallets. Thank you governor Hochul for your thoughtful, respectful approach."

Assemblymember Yudelka Tapia said, "I support Governor Hochul's decision of pausing the 'Congestion Pricing Toll.' Flat FY2025 State Budget for Roads Underscores Needs for Transportation

Despite widespread support from regional lawmakers to add millions of dollars to the FY2025 state budget for Hudson Valley roads and bridges, the final budget passed by the State Legislature and signed by Gov. Hochul last month did not include the much-needed funding to fix deteriorating transportation facilities here in the Hudson Valley.

The setback, however, did not deter a construction industry coalition to continue its call to increase by \$400 million the core program for roads and bridges along with aid to local highway departments, which need another \$250 million to offset the effects of inflation. Both increases were supported by members of the Assembly and Senate in their respective "One-House Budgets."

In terms of transportation funding, the adopted state budget included more than \$8.7 billion in mass transit operating support statewide, including \$884 million in operating support for non-MTA transit systems. It also provided nearly \$7.7 billion for the third year of the record \$33 billion, five-year DOT Capital Plan to improve highways, bridges, rail, aviation infrastructure, non-MTA transit, and DOT facilities. The budget features \$1.3 billion for local roads and bridges, including \$598 million for the Consolidated Local Street and Highway Improvement Program (CHIPS), \$140 million for state touring routes, and \$100 million for the "Pave Our Potholes Program."

Leaders of the Construction Industry Council of Westchester & Hudson Valley, Inc., noted that some program money that was cut by \$100 million in the early rounds of talks, were only partially restored in the final version, reducing the program by \$40 million from last year.

Commenting on the \$237 billion state budget that passed in mid-April, CIC Executive Director John Cooney, Jr., said, "The needs for safety and system improvements far exceeds the allocation for the region over the final two years of the DOT's five-year capital plan. More was needed. The new budget will not attack the backlog of needs, and it falls far short to move the needle in the right direction this season. These advancing needs must be reassessed in the coming years."

Echoing the frustration of transportation advocates in both industry and the public sector, a transportation official in the region noted, "Roadway construction is like a car engine. You give it gas and we'll go. No gas, no go."
