GSA Administrator highlights millions for federal sustainability and clean construction in San Francisco

The U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) Administrator Robin Carnahan toured the historic Appraisers Building in San Francisco to highlight \$11 million in federal funding that will go to building improvements, as part of President Biden's Investing in America Agenda. The project will use low-embodied carbon (LEC) glass and steel, funded through the Inflation Reduction Act, to address energy loss through the curtain wall at the east side of the building. The project will replicate the existing profile of the deteriorated curtain wall, prevent water leakage and incorporate features to improve overall energy-efficiency.

Administrator Carnahan toured the areas where LEC steel and glazing will be used to modernize the original glass curtain wall which is in dire need of repair. Once installed, the new wall will not only meet resilience and sustainability goals, but also preserve the historic character of the original structure.


"The Appraisers Building is a great example of how President Biden's Investing in America agenda and the Inflation Reduction Act are catalyzing the use of clean, sustainable materials while supporting American jobs and manufacturers," said GSA Administrator Robin Carnahan during her visit. "This project embodies the triple win of all our sustainability efforts: creating good jobs, saving taxpayer dollars, and fostering healthier communities across the country."

The Biden-Harris Administration is leading by example to tackle the climate crisis through President Biden's Federal Sustainability Plan. This investment supports GSA on its ambitious path to achieve net-zero emissions from its portfolio of federal buildings by 2045.

Administrator Carnahan's visit coincides with the one-year anniversary of the LEC program, funded by the Inflation Reduction Act, the largest climate investment in American history. During this time, there has been a dramatic market response with an increase of thousands more environmental product declarations used to identify sustainably-manufactured construction materials, a key goal of the Biden-Harris Administration's Federal Buy Clean Initiative. The Federal Buy Clean Initiative leverages federal procurement to catalyze markets for asphalt, concrete, glass, and steel that have lower levels of greenhouse gas emissions associated with their production, use and disposal.

This progress demonstrates how Buy Clean, including GSA's investments, is driving market demand for LEC materials to boost American innovation, create good-paying jobs, and address the climate crisis. This project is one of more than 150 LEC projects that GSA announced last November.

15th consecutive year of top honors for supporting underserved communities

The Department of Labor announced that its procurement practices have earned the department an "A" score — for the 15th consecutive year — on the Fiscal Year 2023 Small Business Procurement Scorecard.

Compiled by the Small Business Administration, the scorecard measures the contracting opportunities federal agencies make available to small, small disadvantaged, women-owned, servicedisabled veteran-owned businesses and those in Historically Underutilized Business Zones or "HUBZones."

The department is one of four agencies — out of the 24 federal agencies rated — that achieved all small business goals at the prime and subcontracting level.

In support of small businesses, the department accomplished the following in FY 2023:

- Achieved \$985 million in contract actions, one of the highest spend in contract dollars at the prime level.
- Awarded two-thirds, or \$118.5 million in subcontracts in underserved communities.
- Awarded women-owned businesses \$151.6 million in prime contracts and \$26.8 million in subcontracts.
- Increased subcontract awards to servicedisabled veteran-owned by 3.4 percent over FY 2022 and awarded \$137 million in prime contracts to disabled-veterans.
- Processed \$295 million to HUBZone communities, marking the highest total in the department's procurement history.
- Increased subcontracts in all underserved communities by 10.77 percent over FY 2022.

The Greenlining Institute Celebrates Supreme Court Ruling **Protecting the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau**

The 7-2 ruling upholds the independence of the consumer watchdog agency which provides critical protections for consumers, including communities of color.

The United States Supreme Court issued a resounding ruling in CFPB v. Community Financial Services Association of America, upholding the funding structure of the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, and overturning a Fifth Circuit Court decision that threatened to undermine the independent agency.

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After the 2008 financial crisis and the Great Recession that followed, the Obama administration enacted a series of financial reforms and regulations through the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, formally establishing the CFPB to oversee Federal financial laws that protect consumers. The CFPB helps ensure the financial market is a level playing field by cracking down on bad financial actors that engage in unfair, deceptive, abusive, and discriminatory practices that harm consumers.

Statement from Debra Gore-Mann, President and CEO at The Greenlining Institute:

"This is a huge win-both for consumers and the integrity of our economic system. With this ruling, the Supreme Court preserves the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau's ability to be funded independently of annual congressional appropriations. This funding structure was intentionally put in place so that our main consumer watchdog agency is empowered to protect consumers and hold the financial industry accountable. The CFPB simply cannot be effective if it is dependent on our volatile political systemone that is heavily influenced by well-funded special interest groups that prioritize industry profits over consumers.

Today's ruling reinforces our collective fight for a fair and just economic system that enables equitable access to wealth and opportunity.

Still, we have a long road ahead of us to ensure economic equity for communities of color and low-income communities that endure the lasting legacies of redlining and disinvestment.

While we celebrate this significant victory, challenges to the CFPB and its role in building a more just economy are increasing. Political and industry interests continue to launch attacks aimed at undermining the CFPB's effectiveness and maintaining the status quo of economic inequity. We must remain vigilant in safeguarding the CFPB from these attacks so it can continue its crucial role in our economy."

Ahead of first major heat wave of the year, here's how California is keeping people safe

With a heatwave impacting much of inland California this week, Governor Gavin Newsom today highlighted the state's continued preparedness and response efforts and urged Californians to take steps to protect themselves from extreme heat. Beginning today, excessive heat watches and warnings will be in place. According to the National Weather Service (NWS), temperatures in the Central Valley may reach up to 105 degrees, with Death Valley National Park likely reaching 118-121 degrees.

Given this extreme weather, the state is entering phase 2 of its Extreme Temperature Response Plan, which is triggered by NWS predictions of excessive heat activity and moves the state into action to coordinate an all-hands response by the state government.

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Extreme heat can be deadly. Together, let's do everything we can to stav safe. The state is taking action to protect and inform communities and Californians should take steps now to protect themselves from the heat. Stay cool, stay OF hydrated, and stay connected.

As the changing climate is making heat waves more intense and frequent, extreme heat kills more Americans each year than any other extreme weather events, including wildfires, droughts, and floods.

Ahead of Memorial Day Weekend, Governor Newsom announced the launch of ready.ca.gov - a new one-stop shop for Californians to prepare for emergencies and extreme weather. The new website is part of Listos California, which is a state effort that connects communities with in-language resources before, during and after emergencies. The Governor also visited the California Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) to receive updates on the administration's preparedness for summer and peak wildfire season.

State agency actions

State efforts to prepare Californians for the increased temperatures include:

Cal OES is coordinating with local governments and emergency managers on any regional needs. A current list of local cooling centers open by county can be found here. Through Listos California, Cal OES is deploying in-language preparedness messaging to California's most impacted communities and those who may be most at risk during extreme temperatures, including those 65 years of age or older; individuals with chronic illness, disabilities or who are pregnant. In addition, through the state's Priority Populations Task Force. Cal OES convenes over 20 agencies to coordinate state resources, identify and address unmet needs, and ensure comprehensive preparedness and response in support of Californians at greatest risk.

The California Division of Occupational Safety and Health (Cal/OSHA) is also reminding employers to protect workers from heat illness during high temperatures by providing water, rest, shade and training. Field inspectors are conducting targeted inspections at worksites where workers are most vulnerable to heat illness including in agriculture and construction. Details on heat illness prevention requirements and training materials are available online at 99calor.org. Cal/OSHA's heat illness prevention standard applies to all outdoor worksites.

The Government Operations Agency has coordinated messaging to all state employees on increased temperature preparedness and worked with building managers to reiterate state efficiencies during warmer days.

The California Natural Resources Agency and state climate partners are putting actions in motion to increase climate resilience and address longer-term impacts of climate change and extreme heat





events through the Extreme Heat Action Plan to Build Community Resilience. Efforts include resources for vulnerable and underserved communities, investments in shading communities through green schoolyards and urban forestry initiatives, and putting nature-based solutions to work to cool buildings and infrastructure.

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) has created a Heat & Summer Safety toolkit to provide resources and communication tools that can be shared, including the difference between heat exhaustion and heat stroke. CDPH also develops heat guidance for schools, local health jurisdictions, and other community service providers to protect Californians, particularly heat-vulnerable populations like children, students, older adults, the unhoused, outdoor workers, and those with existing health conditions.

How you can stay safer from extreme heat

Stay cool (During the hottest times of the day):

- Those without air conditioning should check with their city or county for cooling centers or visit public locations such as a library or shopping mall.
- Avoid physical exertion or exercising outdoors.
- Wear lightweight, light colored, loose clothing, hats, sunglasses and sunscreen.

Stay hydrated:

- Drink plenty of fluids, especially water, even when not thirsty; drink sports drinks (in moderation with water) to help replace electrolytes lost during exercise.
- Avoid sugary, alcoholic, and very cold drinks.
- Eat plenty of fruits and vegetables.

Stay connected:

Stay informed:

Stay safe outdoors:

- Monitor those at high risk of heat-related illness including infants and young children; people 65 years of age or older; individuals with chronic illness, disabilities or who are pregnant.
- Californians are also encouraged to check on their neighbors – call or visit vulnerable people, and offer to pick up groceries, medication, and other necessities. Older adults, young children and babies, people with chronic medical conditions and those who are pregnant are most vulnerable.

Use a buddy system when working in the heat.

Check the local news for weather forecasts,

extreme heat alerts, and cooling centers.

Warm summer weather is causing continued

snow melt from winter's record snowpack, re-

sulting in colder and faster water that continues today. Remember to always be safe around the water:

- Make sure you and your loved ones wear properly fitting, U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jackets. Several public and private entities make life jackets available to the public on a loan basis.
- Always supervise children by appointing a designated "water watcher."
- Know your limits. Swimming in a lake, ocean or river is different than swimming in a pool.
- If someone is in distress, seek help from a lifeguard or call 9-1-1 if one is not available.

Since its completion in 1944, the Appraisers Building has housed immigration and customs agencies of the federal government. Today, it is the regional administrative center for the Department of Homeland Security, including U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services. Approximately 1,000 people visit the facility daily to attend naturalization ceremonies, obtain Permanent Resident Cards or process asylum requests. GSA plans to initiate the procurement for this work over the coming month.

The Inflation Reduction Act includes \$3.4 billion for GSA to use its buying power to promote the development and manufacturing of LEC construction materials, and other ways to make federal facilities more sustainable and cost-efficient. GSA's Inflation Reduction Act projects will implement new technologies and accelerate GSA's efforts in achieving a net-zero emissions federal building portfolio by 2045.

Governor Hochul Unveils Application Guidelines for More Than \$11 Million in ConnectALL Funding to Expand Broadband Access Ahead of Application Launch Later This Month

Governor Kathy Hochul unveiled application guidelines for more than \$11 million in new grant programs under Empire State Development's ConnectALL Initiative, the largest-ever investment in New York's digital infrastructure, ahead of the launch of the applications on June 17. Together, the programs - the Regional and Local Assistance Program and the Digital Equity Technical Assistance Fund - will prepare local government and nonprofit organizations to participate in upcoming broadband deployment and digital equity programs across the state. The Governor also issued guidelines for a precertification application, set to launch June 21, to help interested internet service providers access federal broadband funding under the ConnectALL Deployment Program.

"Affordable, reliable broadband is an absolute necessity for New Yorkers looking to get an education, access vital government resources and participate in a 21st century economy," Governor Hochul said. "We are issuing these guidelines now to give applicants a running start in accessing critical broadband funding that will get more New Yorkers online and expand high-speed internet statewide."

Empire State Development President, CEO and Commissioner Hope Knight said, "Closing the dig-

ital divide is critical to unlocking economic growth and reducing inequities in our society. By connecting families to high-speed internet, we are connecting them to jobs, opportunities and services. These new programs complement our existing suite of programs and will allow us to move one step closer to achieving our goal of internet for all."

The Regional and Local Assistance Program will provide grants or technical assistance to eligible applicants for program funding to include noncapital resources, technical assistance and planning which could include feasibility studies or digital equity research, identifying areas in need of internet service or new investments in broadband, or the development of financing for broadband facilities. More detailed information is available in the program guidelines. To prepare for the opening of the Regional and Local Assistance Program, the ConnectALL Office will hold an informational webinar on June 25, 2024. Webinar registration is available here.
