

CAHSR Celebrate Caltrain's electrification as key part of high-speed rail plan

It's a big week for high-speed rail in California.

The California High-Speed Rail Authority named its new CEO, Ian Choudri – and today, Choudri joined Governor Gavin Newsom in San Francisco to help celebrate the debut of Caltrain's new electrified train fleet that will transform rail service in the Bay Area and play a key role in California's high-speed rail system.

The electrification project and electric trains were supported by more than \$1.3 billion in state funding, including more than \$700 million from high-speed rail, and will serve as the Bay Area's connection to California high-speed rail. Caltrain's electrification and high-speed rail are key projects as part of Governor Newsom's build more, faster infrastructure agenda.

In the last year, high-speed rail has marked significant progress – with historic funding from the Biden-Harris Administration, all environmental reviews from Los Angeles to the Bay Area complete, trainset selection underway, station and track construction on deck, and nearly 14,000 good paying jobs created.

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How Investing in Equity Fosters the Goals of Investing in America

When the President took office, he identified a number of challenges in the American economy, including decades of rising inequality and the rapidly rising costs of climate change, which disproportionately harms lower-income communities. The President promised to build back better, putting in place a historic Investing in America agenda and prioritizing game-changing invest-

ments to enhance productive capacity across the country. But growth without equity is insufficient to empower working people and communities that for too long have been overlooked or left out by federal investment. Combatting systemic barriers and ensuring our Investing in America agenda reaches all communities improves people's lives while also supporting a strong economy. For the 60th anniversary of the Civil Rights Act, the President is celebrating several achievements that have aimed to address inequality.

Since the beginning of this administration, President Biden and Vice President Harris have taken steps to advance equity and racial justice. From preserving African American history and culture to delivering a historically robust economic recovery for all Americans, the administration's policies have prioritized equity. The President's economic agenda does this by spurring investment in all communities – including in disadvantaged communities, and encouraging the creation of high-quality jobs.

This blog describes the economics of how investing in equity both empowers workers today and into the future and fosters stronger economic growth.

Improving racial and economic equity is a path to increasing overall economic growth

Addressing inequality leads to a more dynamic and resilient economy. Increased equity means that everyone has a chance to develop their skills efficiently and deploy their talents most effectively. Conversely, when people are unable to reach their full productivity because of discrimination or systemic inequality, the overall economy suffers.

Looking at these effects across the entire economy shows that the economic costs of inequality are quite high. For example, a study in *Econometrica* analyzes the changes in demographics of high-skilled occupations between 1960 and 2010. The authors estimate that during this period, improved job opportunities and talent allocation for women and communities of color drove up to 40 percent of the growth in aggregate U.S. gross domestic product (GDP) per person. Figure 1 depicts actual growth and growth in a counterfactual scenario without the increased access to opportunity.

These effects of inequality continue to reverberate throughout the economy. Research from authors at the San Francisco Federal Reserve Bank, Boston University, and Stanford University found that during the 30 year period from 1990 to 2019, the estimated economic cost to the total U.S. economy of racial and ethnic economic inequality was over \$25 trillion. This study assumes that earnings were the same across all demographic groups, and then computes the labor earnings contribution to GDP. By eliminating

DFPI Awards \$4 Million to Community-Based Organizations for Financial Education and Empowerment Programs

The California Department of Financial Protection and Innovation (DFPI) today announced it has awarded \$4 million in CalMoneySmart grants for the 2024-2026 grant cycle. This year's slate of 15 nonprofit organizations expands the program's geographic coverage to include the North State and Central Coast regions of the state.

"The CalMoneySmart program can play a key role in advancing financial wellbeing of underserved communities across California. It provides individuals with the vital tools to achieve financial stability and to begin building wealth for generations to come," said Business, Consumer Services and Housing Agency Secretary Tomiquia Moss. "We congratulate these 15 community-based organizations that are delivering essential financial skills, knowledge, and confidence to help Californians successfully navigate our complex financial world."

The CalMoneySmart program, established in 2019 when Governor Gavin Newsom signed SB 455 (Bradford), supports community-based organizations in providing free financial education and empowerment programs to the most vulnerable unbanked and underbanked consumers. Encompassing web- and classroom-based content, individualized coaching, and innovative financial products, these community programs aim to support participants' long-term financial stability and independence. In the first three years of the pro-

gram, more than 46,000 participants were served by 36 grantee organizations.

"We are excited to expand access to much-needed financial resources and educational tools to the North State and Central Coast regions of California through the CalMoneySmart program," said DFPI Commissioner Clothilde V. Hewlett. "The knowledge and guidance our grantees provide support unbanked and underbanked Californians in imagining and reaching their financial goals. The DFPI is honored to partner with this diverse group of organizations to expand economic security and economic mobility in our state."

Beginning in 2024, eligible organizations were able to apply for two consecutive years of funding. This change, combined with wide promotion through social media, state legislative offices, and other stakeholders, resulted in the Department receiving 189 applications, nearly double the number of applications from the prior fiscal year. Each grant proposal was evaluated for eligibility and program effectiveness, resulting in the awarding of \$4 million in grant funding over two years to 15 nonprofit organizations.

The CalMoneySmart Program was created with funding from the Financial Empowerment Fund, established by Senate Bill 455, setting the DFPI to administer an application process and have its commissioner award grants to specified nonprofits for financial education and empowerment programs and services to unbanked and underbanked populations in California. The total amount that can be awarded

each fiscal year is \$2,000,000 with a maximum of \$200,000 per grantee.

CPUC Recommends Fourth Round of Grant Awards for Last Mile Broadband Infrastructure Projects Across California

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) today announced the fourth round of recommended awardees for last mile broadband projects as part of the \$2 billion Last Mile Federal Funding Account Grant Program. This program expands broadband internet access for underserved and unserved communities across California. This announcement continues a rolling process

of awards and recommendations, highlighting the state's commitment to bridging the digital divide through Broadband For All.

Continuing to invest where it matters most

Many awardees are creating new networks, connecting the next generation to education, improving access to healthcare, and empowering rural communities for economic development and emergency connectivity. Combined, these proposed projects will serve predominantly dis-

advantaged and low-income communities across the state.

This fourth Draft Resolution recommends awarding up to \$143.3 million for 12 Last Mile Federal Funding Account broadband infrastructure grant projects in Mono, Nevada, Placer, Riverside, Sacramento, San Bernardino, and San Mateo counties. The recommendation includes a grant to the Colorado River Indian Tribes in Riverside and San Bernardino counties.

Draft Resolutions with award recommendations will be released through the rest of the year, each open for public comment. These recommendations will be considered and must be approved by vote of the CPUC's Commissioners at a public Voting Meeting.

The Draft Resolution issued today is on the CPUC's website and will be on the Aug. 22, 2024 Voting Meeting agenda.

these earnings gaps, prosperity would improve for racial minorities as well as the broader population. For instance, in 2019 alone, the authors find that eliminating gaps by race and ethnicity would have generated an additional \$1.15 trillion to GDP.

The strong economic recovery made under President Biden has improved inequality along several metrics. Recent research shows that coming out of the pandemic recession, wage inequality has decreased—making a dent in decades of rising inequality. Using similar methodology to compute indexed real (inflation-adjusted) wages, the Council of Economic Advisers (CEA) found that in the post-pandemic period, low-income workers saw their wages grow by a higher percentage than those of high-income workers. Updated analysis indicates that between 2019:Q1 and 2024:Q1, real wages increased by 14 percentage points more for low-income workers than for high-income workers.

The economy has also made progress on reducing racial inequality. For example, CEA found that between the second halves of 2019 and 2023, real average wages increased 9.5 percent for Black workers and 6.7 percent for white workers, reducing economic inequality across race. The progress also extends to employment status. In April 2023, the Black unemployment rate hit an all-time record low of 4.8 percent (Figure 2). A strong economy produces benefits for workers of color, and as a consequence, improves racial equity.

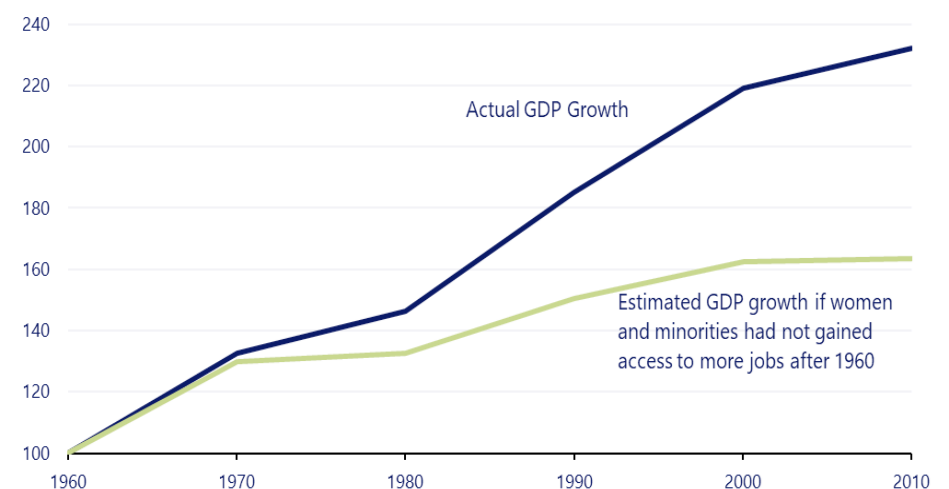
Focusing on places too often left behind is good for growth

The Biden-Harris administration is also committed to supporting minority-owned businesses. The Small Business Boom Report highlights that since 2020, both Black- and Latino-owned businesses saw a 4-percentage point increase in the share of government-backed Small Business Administration (SBA) loans.

Caltrain's electrification as key part of high-speed rail plan

"Caltrain's project is an important piece to the bigger vision of electrified rail throughout California," said Ian Choudri, incoming CEO of California High-Speed Rail Authority. "I'm proud to join the Governor, state and federal leaders today to mark this important milestone. Let's keep building on today's momentum for the future of transportation."

The Peninsula Corridor Electrification Project converts the Caltrain corridor between San Francisco and San Jose from diesel to an electric service that reduces emissions and enhances capacity. It also equips the corridor to accommodate future California High Speed Rail service. Caltrain estimates that corridor electrification will reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 250,000 tons annually, equivalent to taking 55,000 cars off the roads. After completion:

- Express trains will operate in under an hour, compared to 65 minutes today.
- Local trains will operate in 75 minutes, compared to 100 minutes today.
- 16 stations will have service every 15-20 min in peak periods, compared to only 7 today.
- Every station will have service every 30 min mid-day, evenings and weekends, compared to hourly today.

Porto's Bakery and Café in West Covina

Last fall, Porto's Bakery and Café, a family-owned small chain of Southern California Cuban bakeries, was making plans to expand to its fifth location in West Covina, and needed to fill more than 260 positions. So they turned to the San Gabriel Valley Workforce Services America's Job Center of CaliforniaSM (AJCC) office for assistance.

The bakeries' human resources supervisor Mari-sol Reiner worked with the Employment Development Department's (EDD) employment program representative Eileen Chavez to recruit employees for the newest Porto's Bakery and Café location. Reiner needed to find qualified employees that included cooks, cashiers, decorators, sales associates, servers, hostesses, bakers, and maintenance personnel.

The bakeries began when Rosa and Raul Porto Sr., who emigrated from Cuba to California in the 1960s, started selling cakes out of their home using family recipes. The recipes have been passed on to their three children - Beatriz, Raul Jr., and Margarita - who are continuing the dream of bringing quality desserts and foods to people in Southern California and by online orders to customers throughout the United States.

Together with West Covina Business Services, EDD's Chavez collaborated with Porto's Bakery and Café to set up a five-day recruitment event at the San Gabriel Valley's AJCC office. During this successful hiring event, 517 applicants were inter-



viewed, which led to 72 hires. More than 30 applicants were identified as potential candidates for on-the-job training opportunities provided by West Covina Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act partner, Managed Career Solutions.

"Because we are a family business, we hope we can be an anchor to the community and help to inspire families to come gather here, enjoy our good food, low prices, and welcoming environment,"

said Beatriz Porto, co-owner Porto's Bakery and Café. "I hope they come and see what we have been able to accomplish and it will encourage others to start businesses here in West Covina as well."

The grand opening for the new Porto's Bakery and Café in West Covina was last month.

BACKGROUND

This is Arcata's newest nano brewery, focusing on hand made small batch brews using only finest ingredients, served at peak freshness. During their start up phase, they are beginning with one new beer per month. They're working on developing a brew cycle that makes the most sense for growth, but also stays consistent with their mission and vision.

CHALLENGES

The owner and brewer, Jeff, says that he knew how to make beer really well. He knew the logistics of producing a beer, but he had no idea about pricing, permitting, and running a business. His SBDC advisor kept him for undercharging his product. He appreciated the mentorship and oversight. He also found support that his idea was good and the perspective that successful businesses can start small, gave him the confidence to keep moving toward his dream.

ACTION

The client attended SBDC's Food Flight program, where he had support from the instructors and from the participants. Between the flight program and working with his advisor, he was supported through writing his

business plan, pricing his product, and embracing a professional branding and marketing strategy.

The client secured the financing necessary to remodel his location and bring his dream to fruition, launching in September 2023.
