

DELIVERING RESULTS IN 2024: Bass Highlights Unprecedented **Green Year** for L.A.

Mayor Karen Bass joined by environmental leaders in Downtown Los Angeles to announce more green jobs, historic electric vehicle infrastructure expansion and improved alternative water access this year in her efforts to build a greener Los Angeles. Highlights include:

- The City of L.A. reached its goal set in 2019 of creating more than 100,000 green jobs by the end of 2025 more than one year early.
- Los Angeles has the most EV charging stations in the country. Nearly 16,000 EV chargers have been installed over the past two years, a 77% increase in the city’s available charging infrastructure since Mayor Bass took office.
- 250,000 homes in Los Angeles are now powered by clean energy through the Eland Solar & Storage Center, a large-scale solar installation and battery storage system that opened this year.

This week and next, in the run up to her second anniversary in office on December 12, Mayor Bass is crisscrossing the city to highlight how her administration has made change and delivered results to reduce homelessness and homi-



cides, create jobs, support businesses, combat climate change, and better deliver city services.

“We have worked urgently to build a greener Los Angeles to make a healthier and more sustainable city,” said Mayor Bass. “Our work has led to significant increases in EV charging infrastructure, record amounts of storm water captured, and reducing emissions throughout the city with the goal of hitting 100% clean energy by 2035. Together, in partnership with all levels of government, we will

continue to create a cleaner, healthier and more sustainable city for Angelenos.”

“Your Los Angeles Department of Water and Power is proud to join Mayor Bass and the City Council to secure a clean energy future and reliable water supply for Los Angeles for the years to come,” said Janisse Quiñones, LADWP CEO and Chief Engineer. “We are making significant investments in infrastructure and programs to ensure our city continues to weather the impacts

of climate change and maintain access to critical life services of water and power. We are here to show the world how Los Angeles is a model of innovation and sustainability in the United States and the world.”

California advances GenAI projects to streamline state work on housing, budget, and jobs

Building upon Governor Newsom's GenAI Executive Order to safely and responsibly integrate GenAI into state operations, California announced new progress in efforts to explore using GenAI to address critical issues that are top of mind for Californians: housing, budget, and jobs. The state is also launching a new website, GenAI.ca.gov, focused on the work happening in California.

Today's announcement follows September's first large-scale GenAI Innovator Showcase event, where more than 30 tech innovators including Esri, Microsoft, OpenAI, Google and My Town AI presented how they can leverage GenAI to help solve critical challenges. Using the research gathered, the state has chosen to move into the next phase, a formal procurement process where innovators will bring refined solutions to the table and compete to partner with the state.

"Our hard work is paying off after months of thorough research and engaging with the innovator community to determine whether GenAI is the answer to some of the challenges the state is currently facing," said **Government Operations Secretary Amy Tong**. "Governor Newsom has made clear his priority to leverage technology and innovation to deliver a government that works for every Californian, while also keeping the state a global leader in cutting-edge tech."

GenAI solutions for housing

Within the Business, Consumer Services and Housing Agency, the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) is seeking to track the creation and implementation of housing plans, programs, and initiatives across the state more efficiently and quickly. Using GenAI may increase transparency and accuracy, enabling HCD to provide more equitable housing services across California.

"We need to utilize all the tools at our disposal to improve the lives of all Californians," said Business, Consumer Services and Housing Agency Secretary Tomiquia Moss. "By using GenAI to better track and evaluate how local jurisdictions are planning and building housing across California, we can address barriers to housing development and promote affordable housing investments in neighborhoods of opportunity."
