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## This foundation tries to get young Californians into transportation jobs

UC Berkeley professor Susan Shaheen has sent over a dozen students to the Education Symposium, a two-day conference that exposes college juniors and seniors in California to careers in transportation.

During the event, students learn about the transportation industry, get matched with a mentor, meet with practitioners in the field and participate in a competition. At the end, they're eligible to apply for three Education Symposium scholarships to enter the industry.

The symposium is organized by the California Transportation Foundation, a non-profit started by Heinz Heckeroth, a former deputy director for the California Department of Transportation. The foundation works to make students interested in transportation careers, offering dozens of scholarships to students to enter the field, among other things.

"My perception has been that a lot of people who go to it are very inspired," Shaheen, who is on the board for the foundation, said. "You're hearing from people who are really senior in the field, and they're talking to you, they're focused on you, they're answering your questions, and working side-by-side with you on a project for the symposium."

As part of this year's symposium, held in Fresno in November, students participated in a mock grant competition, designing proposals to address sustainable transportation. "Transportation is not necessarily the sexiest career choice," said Marnie Primmer, the executive director for the foundation. "It doesn't have all the bells and whistles that maybe some other career choices open to students, but that's why our education symposium is such a great opportunity, because it introduces students to what it's really like to be a transportation professional."


Part of what makes the program successful is the type of mentors it's able to recruit, according to Primmer and Shaheen. These include people working in both the public and private sectors and academia. They range from engineers to planners to policymakers and many of them are high-ranking in their sphere, with several former directors of Caltrans serving as mentors.

A key challenge Primmer faces with courting students is helping them understand exactly what jobs there are in the transportation industry: everything from the engineers that design highways to the policymakers that plan public transit systems to the maintenance workers who keep the systems functioning.

In the past few years, the industry has seen a dip in students interested in transportation, Primmer said. For example, engineering students have opted for careers in software engineering instead of civil engineering. However, this is changing as students seek more hands-on careers, she said.

"If you work on a highway project, or you work on a new transit system, you actually get to see the fruits of your labor and the impact that it makes on your community," she said. "With many students who are interested in passion projects, and in connecting their purpose with

## Fewer Than Half the States Meet Recommended Cybersecurity Goals

#### In Brief:

- Nearly all states participated in the Nationwide Cybersecurity Review to assess their cyber strengths and weaknesses. Less than half reached or surpassed the recommended minimum level of cyber maturity.
- Many governments lack advanced abilities to detect potential threats, or procedures for taking away lessons after suffering a cyber incident.
- Chief information officers say lack of funding and recruiting enough staff are big challenges. A federal assistance program may be on the chopping block under the Trump administration.

Cyber attacks are a huge concern for state and local governments. Falling victim can mean downed services, compromised sensitive information, stolen money, and costly response and recovery work. Cybersecurity tops state chief information officers' priority lists for 2025, according to the National Association of State Chief Information Officers.

But governments at all levels face challenges in this area, with funding and cyber professionals often in short supply. Figuring out the next steps for ramping up cybersecurity — and getting executive buy-in to do so — can be easier if the government knows what its strengths and weaknesses are and how it matches up against its peers.

The Nationwide Cybersecurity Review (NCSR) aims to provide that kind of information. The NCSR is a voluntary self-assessment that helps state, local, tribal and territorial governments, as well as state agencies and local departments, understand how well they're prepared to deter and respond to cyber attacks. It's sponsored by the Department of Homeland Security and the Multi-State Information Sharing and Analysis Center and offered at no cost.

Last year, 48 states participated in the NCSR, which ranks governments on a scale from 1 to

7. Twenty-two achieved a score of 5 or higher. Getting such a score reflects that states have documented policies and procedures and are in the process of of aligning them with a formal security framework. States scoring below 5 might not yet have a formal cybersecurity policy in place, or may still be working on documenting standards and procedures that support the policy.

Local governments averaged just above 4 on the scale. These respondents included counties and cities, as well as K-12 public school districts, local police, public utilities and others. About 1,248 out of 3,122 participating local government entities (or 40 percent) hit the recommended score of 5 or more. A significant portion of other respondents appeared either to not conduct cybersecurity activities or do so with "informal, ad hoc processes."

In general, state, local, tribal and territorial participants showed strengths in identity management and access control, restricting access to facilities and assets to only authorized users or devices. Many were also prepared to respond to contain a cyber incident and limit its impact. Participants also commonly had some level of continuous security monitoring in place.

But governments overall showed weaknesses when it came to having more advanced threat detection capabilities. Many lacked a formal strategy for assessing risks. They didn't always analyze cyber incidents after they occurred, which would allow them to learn and then update their strategies, policies or procedures. And many in the government sector didn't formally review and update their disaster recovery plans.

#### An Ongoing Problem

Governments are facing off against hackers who keep upping their game, launching more sophisticated ransomware and phishing attacks. Public-sector entities worry about emerging technologies, including malicious parties using artificial intelligence against them. They worry about their own potentially harmful mistakes when using AI to automate operations.

their career, civil engineering becomes a much more attractive opportunity, because you're actually seeing the results of the work you put in."

Many of Shaheen's students are interested in sustainable transportation, particularly since she directs the Innovative Mobility Research lab at the Transportation Sustainability Research Center at Berkeley. "With any transition, the jobs do change," she said. "When we go from horse and carriage to car, there's major changes. And when you make changes to electronics, to the sensing systems, or the propulsion systems and how they're fueled, that involves education and workforce development."

Another major shift in the industry, perhaps the biggest one, is self-driving cars, Primmer said. Google, Apple, Ford, Mercedes, Tesla, Honda, Toyota and more are all working on self-driving programs.

"I think that technology is advancing in a way that will be transformative for transportation in the next 5 to 10 years," she said. "But I do think that opens up new opportunities for students who are tech savvy and who are willing to be the bridge between how we've always done things, and how we're going to do things in the future.

Primmer says one of the most important ways to attract students to the industry is storytelling, which helps them put it in perspective.

"It's the foundation of everything we do," she said. "You can't get to your dentist appointment, you couldn't get there if you didn't have a good transportation network. Your access to education, your access to good paying jobs, your access to amenities in your community, is all dependent on a functioning transportation network
